BOOK TALK ASSIGNMENT AND RUBRIC

One of the best ways to find a new book to read is by word of mouth. Sometimes we get excited about reading if a friend tells us about a book that they really liked.

Your job is to choose a book that you enjoyed reading. Deliver a 3-5 minute Book Talk to the class so that they can hear why you enjoyed this book. Look at the list below to give you some ideas about the kind of details to include in your book talk. Read the BookTalk Rubric on the next page so that you will know the grading procedure.

<u>Plot</u> (The action of the story)

- the story includes a number (2, 3, 4 . . .) of suspenseful and surprising events
- the story includes some / many predictable events
- certain parts of the story are confusing / hard to believe
