The Internet is obviously a great place to find good quality information. However, there are also too many web pages that are NOT appropriate. Here is a simple checklist that will help you determine if the web site you are viewing is worthy:

- Is the date present?
- Is the author's name present?
- AAAA Is the company/organization/publisher/university name present?
- Is this a well-known institution? (Some quality names are National Geographic, MacLean's, Time, The Western Star, The New York Times, Popular Mechanics, Microsoft, Corel, Sun Microsystems, Memorial University, Dalhousie University, York University, McGill University, CBC, CTV etc.)

If you answer YES to most or (better yet) all these questions, you can be sure that the site is reliable. You can feel safe to use quotes from this source.

The referencing style we will be using at Xavier is MLA (Modern Language Association). You should have a pamphlet explaining this particular style. If you lose this sheet, simply visit, http://teacher-mr-davis.yolasite.com and print another copy for yourself from the ELA 8 area. Use this referencing style in the table below.
